Dr. Shashikant Apte

Dr Shashikant Apte is a well-known Haematologist in Pune. He is famous for his outstanding skills in Haematology and is currently working as a Senior Consultant Haematologist at Sahyadri Hospitals, Pune, India.

He specialises in diagnosing, managing, and treating diseases related to blood and blood-producing organs. He is also associated with the department of Bone Marrow Transplant. He has done MD (General Medicine) MBBS from K.E.M Hospital, Mumbai and FRCPA (Hematology) from Royal College of Pathologists of Australia.

Dr. Apte started Bone Marrow Transplant Program in Pune and has done more than 600 Bone marrow Transplants which includes more than 100 Allogeneic Transplants. Dr. Apte undertook Bone Marrow Transplant for Acute Myeloid Lukemia at Vellore and also has a clinical profile and management of 19 patients with Agranulocytosis.

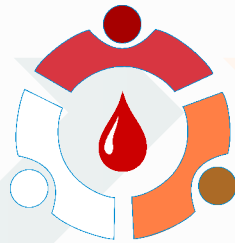
He also did a paper presentation at the 34th Annual Conference of the Indian Society of Haematology and Blood Transfusion, Mumbai.



Dr. Johnny Mahlangu

Johnny Mahlangu is a Professor of Haematology and Head of School of Pathology in the Faculty of Health Sciences of the University of the Witwatersrand and the National Health Laboratory Service. He is also a Consultant Clinical Haematologist in Charge of Haematology at the Charlotte Maxeke Johannesburg Academic Hospital and Director of the International Haemophilia Training Centre in Johannesburg. Johnny received his undergraduate and postgraduate training in science and medicine at the University of the Witwatersrand with haematology specialist and clinical haematology subspecialist qualifications through the Colleges of Medicine of South Africa. His main area of research is novel therapies in bleeding disorders in which he has served as Principal Investigator for over 90 international multicentre studies. He has published over 130 peer review journal articles and presented more than 400 oral and posters at national and international scientific meetings

Prof Mahlangu is current President of the College of Pathologists in South Africa, Chairman of the South African Medical Research Council Board and Chairman of the International Society on Haemostasis and Thrombosis scientific and standardization Committee on Factor VIII, FIX and rare bleeding disorders. He is a recipient of many awards the most recent include the Wits University Vice-Chancellor Academic citizenship award in 2018, the Novo Nordisk Haemophilia Foundation International Haemophilia Community Award in 2018, the American Society of Haematology Global Capacity Building award in 2019, the Publons top 1% cross-field reviewer award in 2019, Wits University Vice-Chancellor Research award for 2020 and an elected member of the Academy of Science of South Africa in 2020.
